



The Riverside County Department of Animal Services is excited to announce the reopening of the San Jacinto Animal Campus and is hiring for various positions. The Department has multiple opportunities for Registered Veterinary Technicians and Supervising Registered Veterinary Technicians in Jurupa, San Jacinto, and/or Coachella. Training for these positions may take place in either Jurupa and/or San Jacinto.

The Registered Veterinary Technician will be responsible for performing routine animal checkups and providing support during emergencies. Duties include communicating with pet owners to determine changes in their pet's health and well-being, for example, changes in activity levels and/or diet, checking an animal's weight, heartbeat, and other vitals to record in patient files, drawing blood samples or administering medications.

The Supervising Registered Veterinary Technician will plan, direct, and provide administrative guidance to Veterinary Assistants, Registered Veterinary Technicians, and Animal Services Representatives. The Supervising Registered Veterinary Technician will oversee and work with subordinate staff who perform pre-surgery preparatory activities, assist during actual sterilization surgeries, provide post-surgery care of animals, and tend to the overall welfare of the animals that are cared for by the Department of Animal Services. Additionally, this position will be responsible for the ordering, and management of controlled substances, and creating and maintaining a variety of reports.

A Supervising and/or Registered Veterinary Technician may be required to work evenings, weekends and/or holidays. The Registered Veterinary Technician is the first professional level classification in the Registered Veterinary Technician series and reports to a Supervising Registered Veterinary Technician.
