



[San Diego Humane Society](#) is excited to announce the opening of the **Wildlife Medical Supervisor (RVT)** position for its wildlife rehabilitation program, Project Wildlife. This program was established in 1972, operating out of several volunteers' homes for many years before moving to a brick-and-mortar location in the early 1990s. Project Wildlife then merged with San Diego Humane Society in 2014, and this union has provided the program with the essential support needed for its continued success and progress, including the resources to move into our brand new, state-of-the-art wildlife hospital in 2019 - the *Bahde Wildlife Center*. Most recently, the organization merged with another San Diego wildlife center that is now *Project Wildlife Ramona*. Between the two campuses, Project Wildlife admits over 13,000 wild animal patients annually made up of over 320 different species, making us one of the largest wildlife rehabilitation centers in the country. Our team is proud to provide lifesaving care to any sick, injured or orphaned wild animal that calls San Diego home, ranging from fledgling owls to baby opossums to injured coyotes!

The current Project Wildlife medical staff consists of the Director of Wildlife Medicine (who is also the sole full-time veterinarian), one part-time veterinarian, 3 RVTs, 2 veterinary assistants and 1-2 Wildlife Veterinarian Interns. As the program continues to grow, our brand new Wildlife Medical Supervisor will be an essential part of our team who allows us to consistently set the standard for wildlife rehabilitation throughout the country and be the second chance that our incredible and biodiverse native wildlife deserves.

San Diego Humane Society prides itself on our Culture of Care that reflects how we treat all of our staff, volunteers and community members, with our primary mission statement being to "Create a more humane world by inspiring compassion, providing hope and advancing the welfare of animals and people." That is what we do here every single day and what any new staff member can expect when walking through our doors.
